

Jordan grew up going to church with her grandmother, but a relationship with God wasn't really a part of her adult life. When her father was killed in a tragic accident, that's when her interest in faith really began. Even then, she didn't start attending church until she met her husband, Avery. They shared with me the story of how they had attended Cross Point off and on for a couple of years. They had struggled with infertility and lost their first baby last year. They said that they connected at Cross Point, and they began to find healing in the worship music, the message, and prayer. I first talked with them in March, when they were 19 weeks pregnant, and then I met with them in June, about 6 weeks out from the delivery of their baby.


Jordan said she gives all the glory to God for His goodness and wanted to profess it to everyone by pursuing baptism. She said even after years in church, she had never felt this way and was so grateful she had found Cross Point. That night, her husband asked if we ever had anyone get baptized again since he had been baptized when he was younger. He said that he wanted to be baptized along with his wife that upcoming Sunday. So, I had the privilege of baptizing Jordan & Avery on Sunday, June 23rd. It was such an amazing moment to see them baptized together (on her BIRTHDAY, no less, and when they were so close to welcoming their new baby!) Such a special day!



A few weeks ago I began having really weird headaches and vision loss. After the third episode of vision loss in six weeks, I decided to go to the ER to ensure it wasn't something serious. I went in with a positive attitude, but was honestly a little scared. PAUSE...I had been reading for several months in Psalm 91 about how God is my protector and He's a safe place. SO THIS is the Scripture going back and forth in my heart and head as I wait not-so-patiently in an ER. After hours of waiting and testing, the doctor came back and said that somehow I had torn a vertebral artery and it had formed a clot on the inside lining of the artery. She said she would have to admit me and I would need to be on blood thinners to ensure there was no further damage. Hearing this...I was very scared, confused and tearful. I am a healthy, 32-year-old woman and this was the LAST thing I expected. As they admitted me, I remember panicking, but also thinking, "God, you protect me, THIS I know." Seems odd to think of that at such a time, but it was so deep in my soul after months of study. I couldn't help but think, after speaking His Word back to Him, "What's the clot about, God?" My doctor told me it wasn't due to bad health, bad diet or anything, just a "freak accident." I didn't need to know WHY, just that He was protecting me in it. I felt shaky at best. The next day was a bit of a blur, but I was still proclaiming God as my safe place and protector. At my core, I was terrified of the unknown in all of it. The next test came and went, and the doctor came in....

He said, "The MRI showed a stroke, but the strange thing is that it went up just enough to be seen on the scan, but it's as if your body pulled it down and kept it from

causing any lasting damage at all and no other clots." Sitting there hearing nothing but a muffled voice, I thought, "THERE. THERE YOU ARE, GOD. You PROTECTED ME FROM A FULL-BLOWN STROKE." My experience of Him as a protector was SOLIDIFIED. My protector, my safe place, my healer. Psalm 91 in its entirety! God reached down and stopped a STROKE in my body. The God of the universe protects me. It was so personal, so deep for me. I heard someone say once, "In order to learn about who God is for you, you must have a REVELATION of Him and He must back that up with EXPERIENCE so that you might really know Him for who he is for YOU personally." I've experienced a true awakening in my soul. One that I've longed for, for a long time now. I will never be the same. He does what He says He will do!



Once there, we realized there was little for our team to do, because Khmer neighbors had come to help. Unfortunately, he spends a lot of time working in his rice field and hasn't had the money to fix his home. Later, a local villager named Kiet stopped by and stole us all away for an unforgettable afternoon meeting neighbors, eating local fruits and vegetables and learning how to communicate with those who don't share your language.
